NEWS AND VIEWS

Welcome to Wadham Road for today's match in the Love Lane Liverpool Competition First Division 1st XI fixture against Rainford CC. And a warm welcome to their players, officials and supporters too. Rainford, although founded over 100 years ago, are relatively new to the Liverpool Competition only becoming a full member in 2008. They have had mixed fortunes in recent years, being promoted to the Premier League as champions in 2017, but relegated back to the First Division the following season. So far this season they've lost just one match and currently lie 2nd in the league table.

SATURDAY 21st MAY, FIRWOOD BOOTLE v HIGHFIELD CC

Highfield 207 all out (54.3); Firwood Bootle 205-7 (49) Match Drawn

In a thrilling match which went to the last ball before the result was decided, honours were shared in the end. It was a bit of an old boy's reunion at the start as Highfield had two of Bootle's ex-players in their team, captain Mike Farrell and Chris Liptrot who was making his first appearance of the season. And not to be outdone, Majic and I bumped into another old boy in Karen's Café on Stanley Rd before the match, Johnny Westhead. He couldn't join us for the match, he was going to watch his son play at Walton Hall Park in a cup final, so once these formalities were out the way we made our way to the cricket. When the match got underway Bootle made a quick start, taking the first 3 wickets for 39 runs. If Mike Farrell thought his return was going to be productive, he didn't figure that Jhangir Liaqat would pull off a brilliant caught and bowled to remove him after facing just 11 balls. Kieron New and Jhangir bowled unchanged for 21 overs before Danny Davies brought himself on. By this time Highfield had staged a bit of a

revival, with Lakmal and Molyneux putting on a partnership of 59. There was another 50 partnership in the middle order between Brewer and Darbyshire but as wickets fell steadily either side of these half century stands, they were eventually bowled out for 207 after 54.3 overs. Jhangir finished the Highfield innings off, clean bowling the last man and ending with figures of 5-63 off 17.3 overs, backed up by Kieron's 3-68 off 20 overs.

In what looked like a mirror image of Highfield's innings, we also lost three quick wickets, for a total of 22 runs. But Danny Hart and Danny Davies performed a rescue act before Danny Hart had to leave the field suffering from cramp. He'd made 22 runs before he was forced off in the 3rd over of the last hour of play. Danny Davies meanwhile, had taken charge of the partnership. He made 62 runs by that time so when Hart retired (temporarily as it turned out) Tom Meskell came in and between the two of them brought Bootle very close to victory. Tom made 30 runs from 29 balls including 5 fours. Danny Davies was edging ever closer to his century by this time but fell just short when he was on 89 (including 8 fours and 1 six), clean bowled by Lakmal. The game wasn't over yet though, as Joe Nagle took the bowlers on and made a rapid 28 off 28 balls. Unfortunately he was run out going for a third run when we were only 11 runs short of victory. Danny Hart returned to partner Jhangir at the crease for the last 8 balls to try and see us through but to no avail. We needed 10 runs off the last over and Danny scored 5 of those off the first 2 balls, then Jhangir made 2 more but that was the end of the scoring from then. Jhangir was cleaned bowled trying to hit the winning boundary off the last ball which resulted in the match ending in an exciting draw. So credit must be given to the Bootle team in nearly pulling off a win when there didn't seem to be one on the cards.
