SATURDAY 6th MAY, FIRWOOD BOOTLE v HIGHFIELD

Firwood Bootle 185 all out (58.4); Highfield 186-4 (40.1) Highfield won by 6 wickets

Highfield won the toss and put us in to bat, but we lost both openers cheaply. Hermann Rolfes and Danny Davies started to make a promising recovery until Hermann misjudged one which looked like it was going over, so was clean bowled. That left us on 33-3 and in fact it was the middle/lower order that formed some decent partnerships enabling us to reach a respectable total after that slow start. Danny fell short of his half century top scoring with 43 runs which included 9 fours so Ahmed Nabeel then joined Danny Hart and kept the score ticking over to earn our first batting point. Danny managed a big six and Ahmed tried to follow suit going for a big one but was caught out leaving us with our sixth wicket down on 119. Joe Nagle came in and

spread some good shots around the ground before getting caught at long on for 22 off 27 balls, including 2 fours and a six. Danny Hart also made a good contribution scoring 25 runs.
