There was a late change to the team when Jaden Rose turned up at the Club with his hand in plaster due to another cricketing accident at school, so allowing Danny Hart to reclaim his place in the side. At the toss which we won, Shaneil put Ainsdale in to bat first. Jhang and Hermann opened the bowling. It was a fiery spell from both with Hermann taking a wicket in his first over and not long after taking his second too. Although Jhang bowled his 12 overs for little reward he was unlucky on a number of occasions. There were constant plays and misses from the visiting batsmen and a couple of close appeals too, but he played his part being very economical going for less than 3 runs per over.

Kieron's economy rate was even better, going for less than 2 runs per over and he finished with 1-21 off 12 overs, his wicket coming in the next over following the drinks break. As it turned out these bowling figures were crucial in the end when we started our run chase. Obviously the wickets are the main thing especially as we bowled Ainsdale out here, but this proves that keeping the run rate down is just as vital. So the accuracy in line and length helped us out in the end. At the start of the 34th over a complete change in approach was decided upon when spinner Daniyal Shakeel joined captain Shaneil. And it paid off to a certain extent when it prompted a run out leaving Ainsdale on 103-4. Then the match turned in our favour, as they lost the last six wickets for 39 runs to be bowled out for 142. Shaneil returned the best bowling figures taking 3-21 off 8 overs, Hermann 3-29 off 9.3 overs and Daniyal 2-13 off 5 overs. So then it was our turn to struggle as we started our reply and we certainly looked in trouble when the sixth wicket went down at 76. That's when Daniyal Shakeel joined Danny Hart at the crease. They put on a stand of 47 which turned out to be the highest of the match. That got us to 123-7 after Daniyal made 28 runs, the majority of which came from his 5 fours off 23 balls. Danny played a patient innings for his 29 off 41 balls and got us to within 10 runs of victory before he fell too. It made the situation more tense really because now they'd got into our tail. We've had to rely on them in the past though so it wasn't beyond Kieron, Jhangir and Shaneil to see us home and that's how it turned out thankfully as Shaneil hit the winning boundary. For Ainsdale's captain Andy Barlow, it was a one-man fight but all in vain as he top scored for his side (51), and then took 7 of his team's 9 wickets for 49 runs. But a win is a win no matter how Scoop you manage to get it.

2nd XI & OTHER CLUB NEWS

Our 2nd XI still remain top in the league despite losing to Irby last weekend, due to the results of the teams below them.
