

NEWS AND VIEWS

Welcome to Wadham Road for today's match in the Love Lane Liverpool Competition for our 1st Division match against Newton-le-Willows CC. And a warm welcome to their players, officials and supporters too.

We go into this match as holders of the Ray Tyler Cup having beaten Sefton Park last Sunday with a superb display to win the trophy by 9 wickets, but you can read the full story further on in the programme. Our opponents today were crowned Division 1 champions last week with two games left to play when they got a draw against bottom club Ainsdale. And it's well deserved in my opinion after being unceremoniously dumped out of the Premier League at the end of last season. So congratulations to them from everyone at Firwood Bootle CC. As well as the two teams facing up to each other, there's also a bit of a shoot-out developing in the race to become the highest runs scorer in this division. Only 6 runs separate Newton's opener Ben Walkden from our own Hermann Rolfes. Ben is currently on 585 runs while Hermann is just behind on 579 just to put a bit more edge to this game.

The 2nd XI meanwhile are still on course to win the 2nd Division title, getting back to winning ways last weekend beating Fleetwood Hesketh at home by 8 wickets. Caldy in 2nd place failed to take advantage with their game in hand last Sunday when they only managed a draw in their home match against Irby, so that keeps a 33 point distance between us and them. I must mention the individual performances of the 2nd XI players too. Tom Meskell is currently 3rd in the 2nd Division batting table with 399 runs while **Barney Fisher** is in 6th place with 338. Tom also happens to be in the bowling table for the 2nd Division, he's in 4th place with 39 wickets but is actually behind Andy Hunt who's currently in 2nd place having taken 42 wickets. Hannah Gallimore has also made it into the top 10 in this Division taking 28 wickets so far, what a great season she's had by the way. So with a cup final to be played here tomorrow when our 2nd XI host Wigan it's going to be a brilliant weekend of cricket for the Club and hopefully we can add more silverware to our cabinet! Come on out and support the team in their quest for more success.

It's becoming a bit of a habit with us this season, getting good results when seemingly up against the odds. But it's a good habit to have, so once we get a level of consistency in all of our matches, and if possible manage to keep the squad together, then I think this team can go far. Our win here actually helped Newton-le-Willows clinch the 1st Division title even though they only managed a draw at home to Ainsdale, which incidentally relegated Ainsdale to the 2nd Division. When the match began Park were still in with a faint shout of winning the league so when they won the toss they put us straight in to bat. There was no hint of the drama to come when our wickets were falling at regular intervals. Luke James and Ryan Westwell started off quite confidently actually and seem to be developing an understanding at the wicket. They had a bright start and both scored a couple of boundaries in the first few overs. But once they both fell we struggled to keep the scoreboard ticking over and only Hermann showed signs of helping us recover and we were bowled out for 119. This is were we showed some character though and like I said earlier, especially when the odds are against us. Our pacemen were economical but it wasn't until we changed the pace of the attack that the wickets started tumbling. Hermann removed Park's dangerman Mark Rowland who scored 28 out of a 1st wicket partnership of 34 so that was a relief. Once the 7th wicket fell we sniffed blood and as skipper Shaneil set the field, they all closed in on the remaining batsmen so by this time there was nobody fielding on the boundary. He eventually finished with best figures of 5-18 off 9.1 overs. Shakeel wasn't far behind with his own spin, finishing with 3-13 off 7 overs. And it put us all in the mood for the Cup final the following day. One person it didn't seem to affect though was Majic, he cares about the Club obviously but not more than his stomach. Always one for a challenge we'd stopped at Muzzy's Cafe in Birkenhead and he ordered the "Dare to Eat" Scoop breakfast which he promptly demolished. That's all the inspiration he needs!

Westy got his unbeaten 52 off 94 balls which included 7 fours, that must have got him close to being player of the match. When Luke had gone Joshua Andrady walked in and never looked back. He made an excellent unbeaten 40 which included 2 sixes. The second one was the one which clinched the trophy for us. I can't remember a single chance being offered by our batters so all credit again to them. What was so exciting about this match, a cup final don't forget, was we didn't have to just rely on the senior players. Both our youngsters had a huge say in how we won this match. Josh was made player of the match for his contribution with both bat and ball. And Jaden's one wicket of the match was

Daniel Davies will be (hopefully temporarily) hanging up the boots after what has been an outstanding career at Firwood Bootle. Joining from Prestatyn in 2016, Danny has amassed 4,459 runs for the club with an average of 33. Equally impressively, he has taken 168 wickets with a bowling average of just over 18. Danny is the 7th leading run scorer and 23rd leading wicket taker of all time for the club. A page could be made of Danny's countless match winning performances alone. However, his loyalty, wholehearted passion, competitive edge and his love for this great Club sets him apart from the rest. In the shock relegation of 2021, the clubs future looked bleak with 8 of the 11 first teamers leaving the club that year. Danny's passion, selflessness and desires for the Club meant he created a team and atmosphere that narrowly avoided a double relegation. Danny was the glue that kept this great club afloat in a tough couple of years for the team. A team that was rebuilt, and Danny leaves the Club knowing he has created the foundations for us to get back where we should be, at the top of the Premier League. Danny should be proud of what he has achieved here and his contributions, most notably following the shock events of 2021, solidify his status as a true great of the Club.
