

NEWS AND VIEWS

Welcome to Wadham Road for today's match in the Love Lane Liverpool Competition for our 1st Division fixture against Lytham. And a warm welcome to their players, officials and supporters too. We also extend a warm welcome to today's umpires John Dickinson and Les Knowles.

We lost both matches home and away to Lytham last season so there's an incentive for us to try and improve that situation this time. It won't be easy though as they came very close to getting promotion a year ago, only failing in the last couple of games. There are clear signs that we are a team growing in confidence every week so we could be in for an exciting game today, as they are one of about six other teams (and I'd include ourselves in that) all scrapping for places at the top of the table.

SATURDAY 8th JUNE, FIRWOOD BOOTLE v HIGHFIELD Firwood Bootle 199-9 dec (55); Highfield 114 all out (31.4) Firwood Bootle won by 85 runs

It was the Hermann Rolfes and "Ted" Sagar Trivedi Show against Highfield and almost a year to the day when Hermann last scored a century and that was at Wadham Road too against Birkenhead Park. He must like the month of June and although his 115 that day wasn't quite enough to win us the match, this time it was. The South African, in a brilliant all round performance hit an unbeaten 102 featuring 10 fours and 3 sixes from 147 deliveries and took 4 catches behind the stumps. In a similar excellent shift Sagar helped himself to 5-53 and hit 46 in as many balls including 7 fours and 2 sixes. For good measure the pair compiled a very productive 4th wicket partnership which yielded 82 runs. Also important was captain Shaneil Patel-Ponda's contribution who scrambled a single to get Hermann on strike in the final over so he could reach his hundred. His 6 runs off 12 balls were vital and I'm sure Hermann would be the first to acknowledge that. The writing was on the wall for the visitors when Danny Hart, fielding at fine leg, took a spectacular diving catch on the run off the bowling of Sagar, removing top scorer Madduma Lakmal for 35, reducing their side to 71-6. Shaneil introduced himself into the attack in the 31st over and after his fourth delivery removed Sam Rotherham with

the help of a smart catch from Jhangir Liaqat to clinch an excellent triumph by 85 runs and earn 24 points for good measure.

SATURDAY 15th JUNE, MAGHULL v FIRWOOD BOOTLE Maghull 124 all out (43.3); Firwood Bootle 125-4 (24.2)

Firwood Bootle won by 6 wickets

The day started off on the right step with a fine breakfast at Hartley's Garden Centre in Lydiate. Not my first visit there but it was Majic's and it had his seal of approval. It also happens to have a cricket connection. Tom Hartley's mother and father run it, he's in the England T20 World Cup squad at the moment. Tom turned out for Ormskirk many times in the Liverpool Comp before Lancashire CCC snapped him up to join their county squad, so while we're toiling away clearing wet pitches and praying for no more rain, he's with the England squad in Barbados right now! I don't think he's been picked to start a game yet but he's a valuable member of their T20 and full Test squad anyway. In fact the start of this match was delayed because of the weather, but the insistence of both captains to get the match going probably helped the umpire Norman Edwards decide. He was covering this match on his own so I suspect it makes things a little more difficult when the responsibility can't be shared. We eventually got going at 2:30 and there was a first start in the team for Lewis Brown. It's good experience for the young boys to step out in the 1st XI and he actually made a couple of good stops saving boundaries so he played a part in another win. The story of the match wasn't long in coming though as "Ted" Sagar Trivedi produced a fine hat trick removing opener Jon Ring (32) followed by two successful lbw appeals. He finished the match with 4-24 off 10.3 overs, backed up by Hermann Rolfes 2-34 off 11 overs and skipper Shaneil 2-13 off 7 overs, dismissing Maghull for 124. Hermann was on form with the bat again following last week's unbeaten century, as he reached 49, again unbeaten including 7 fours and 1 six ably backed by Ryan Westwell (22) and Sagar (21) to claim a comfortable 6 wicket win.
