



I find I still have the same emotions about the season even 12 weeks later, I just put them down in a different way every time. So now the dust has settled it's time to share these thoughts before I change my mind... again.

It was so nearly a season of celebration, of nearly winning yet another title to place alongside the others in our bulging trophy cabinet. Don't get me wrong, finishing runners up is still a big achievement in the grand scheme of things, as it obviously means gaining promotion back to the Premier League, especially after finishing 9th then 8th in our previous seasons. But still, it's tainted a little by the fact we'd occupied 1st place in the division for the last 11 weeks of the season and only missed out to Colwyn Bay on the final day. So now we've come to the crux of the matter. The last match of the season is why I've been constantly re-writing this piece, the match which would settle where the title should rest for the next 12 months. The anticipation for this match at home to Liverpool was felt all week, but it ended up being a torturous event; not one any of our most loyal supporters could endure again; or anyone else for that matter. I won't dwell on it too much, but to think a side could bat on and on for 72.2 overs to deny us a competitive chase, it's just not in the spirit of the game and it pains me just to type it. In reply we only faced 17 overs before rain stopped play and so dashed our chances of winning the league title. After crunching the numbers I discovered that our home game against St Helens Town took just 54.2 overs to complete (the whole match that is) which we won by 10 wickets! That, I think, puts it into perspective and that is all I am going to print on the matter!

There were some exciting matches throughout the season though and indeed, some startling contrasts too. For example, as mentioned above in our home match against St Helens Town which only took 54 overs to complete, the away match was almost a replica except for the fact it must be one of the lowest scoring matches this club has been involved in recent history. The home match was low scoring but we did win it by 10 wickets, the away match in contrast saw both teams scoring low. It's not hard to believe when you consider every side in the competition had some complaint over the St Helens pitch. For the record, only 125 runs were scored in the entire match which we still won by 7 runs. Having been bowled out for 66, we then proceeded to knock St Helens over for just 59. As if that wasn't enough the match would have ended at least 30 minutes earlier if it hadn't been been for a bizarre interruption half way through our innings. Both sides were evicted from their changing rooms by the local rugby team who apparently have first refusal on their home match day! So the game was halted while both teams emptied their changing rooms and transferred everything to a couple of portacabins on the edge of the ground. Who said cricket was boring? The match figures made fascinating reading as Ali Andrady top scored for us with 20 runs, Hermann Rolfes being the only other batsman to make double figures with 19. He also contributed with the ball, playing a big part moving through the middle order with ease taking 3-5 off 4 overs while Sagar Trivedi was almost unplayable on that pitch, finishing with 4-20 off 10 overs including 6 maidens. Compare that to the home match against Maghull when both teams scored over 300 runs in 100.2 overs. A player from each side scored a century as well in one of the most entertaining matches I've seen in my time at the club to note that Liam Crilly was not the Maghull centurion even though he finished top of the runs chart in the 1st Division. Lachlan Fryer scored an unbeaten102 before declaring the innings on 307-6 off 60.1 overs. When Bootle walked out it was an imposing total to chase but as usual this season it was one we decided to take on. Hermann was at the centre of things again. We got off to a flying start with both openers Ryan Westwell (32) and Steve Rimmer (27) setting a fast pace followed by Ali Andrady keeping up the run rate with 48 off 51 balls. We continued to make good progress in the limited amount of time available and Hermann proved how valuable he is to this team with an outstanding contribution of 123* off 72 balls which included 3 sixes and 13 fours and all this on his birthday!

Surprisingly, this wasn't the best batting performance of the season, that was left for Sagar in the ECB Vitality t20. I'll go into a little more detail further on in my Cup stories of the season, but just to say it was our top individual score of the season, 137* off 63 balls (including 12 sixes and ten fours) finishing on a strike rate of 217.46. There's one more match which deserves a mention in the season's highlights. The away match at Highfield in my experience was unique, both sides ending on 203. At the time, Highfield were 3rd in the table and was always going to be a tough match so a sporting declaration by them of 203-8 (please note Liverpool CC), left us with a good chance of getting a result. Jhangir Liagat took 3-44 off 12 overs, while Josh Andrady was brought on late in the innings but his 2-20 off 4 overs proved vital in the end. When the umpires signalled the last hour of play we still needed 118 to win. I think the pressure must have got to the home side during that final hour as chances went begging and maybe a bit of panic set in. Wicket keeper Joel Welsby missed two stumpings, one which would have dismissed Hermann who ended the match unbeaten on 91 (off just 82 balls and which included 10 fours). Hermann offered up another chance soon after but Ian Hall juggled with it then finally dropped it to save us again. The drama carried on into the final overs when we only needed 10 runs to win. Unfortunately with one over to go Hermann was stranded at the wrong end as we lost Jhangir, so with 3 balls remaining we could only manage one run off Joe Nagle thus having to settle for an exciting draw at the close, Highfield on 203-8 dec off 55 overs and Firwood Bootle 203-7 off 36 overs.

My thanks to everyone who's brains I've picked throughout the season and who probably didn't even know I was doing it. Majic is a big help to me and someone who's opinion I value, although anybody who's opinion was around before the club was formed in 1833! On that basis I was obviously interested to know his views on our chances in the Premier League next season. He was positive but thought it would be a tough challenge and spent longer talking about the new breakfast cafes we'd be visiting on our travels next season which I'm sure he's probably planning right now! Sadly we will be leaving behind some very good ones.
