### **NEWS AND VIEWS**

Welcome to Wadham Road for today's match in the Love Lane Liverpool Competition for our Premier league fixture against Ormskirk CC. And a warm welcome to their players, officials and supporters too. We also extend a warm welcome to today's Umpires Chris Williams and Royal Rajan.

They are all going to be hard matches in the Premier league this season, so on that basis today's won't come any harder as we host the 2024 champions here. But we should take heart from our last home game v. Northern where we fought gallantly for a draw. You can read just how we managed that in the report below. And that is how all our matches must be faced this season, run for run and ball for ball. Nothing is impossible where Firwood Bootle cricket is concerned.

### SATURDAY 3rd MAY, FIRWOOD BOOTLE v NORTHERN Northern 221-5 decl. (48.4); Firwood Bootle 182-9 (46) Match drawn

The Liverpool Comp gave us an early fixture against rivals Northern, but it was one that we took on and didn't give an inch. A draw was probably a fair result in the end. It was one of those draws though, that at the end tasted more like a win! Towards the end of the game we were down to our last pair, so with drama to the very last ball we survived against the odds. I've also noticed something about our first two games, that they have both followed a similar pattern, because when we played our opening match, Birkenhead Park batted first and after 45 overs declared on 236-5. Then in this game Northern, like Park batted first and declared on 221-5 after 48 overs. Maybe both clubs were in the same mindset, that because we're newly promoted they both felt they could bowl us out before we could chase down our target. They were both wrong. We beat Birkenhead Park with some overs to spare, but with Northern being in the Premier league a year or two more than us recently, I don't think we were expected to hold on against them.

So here's how it panned out. Northern won the toss and chose to bat first. Kieron

and Sagar were very economical early on, restricting the visitors to just 26 off the first 10 overs and taking a wicket as a bonus. Kieron continued in that vein and although he didn't claim a wicket he certainly played a part for the team bowling 14 overs for just 31 runs which included 5 maidens. Sagar had the best figures taking 3-73. Shaneil took the other two removing Liam Grey, who tried to take him on advancing down the track but was clean bowled for 54; then Tyler McGladdery another danger man also fancied his chances but quick thinking by Kris Ali had him stranded out of his crease and stumped for 36. Once they reached 220 skipper Steve Lucas called them in and declared the innings setting us a target of 222 to win.

We didn't start so well when our innings got under way, losing the first 4 wickets for 23 runs. But Ivan Kriek and Kris (who are beginning to form a good partnership in matches) made 40 runs between them. By this time, 5 wickets down there was little hope of winning but every chance of saving the match. Ivan then formed another vital partnership this time with Jhangir which reached 48 runs, before Liam Grey

had him caught behind for 36. Ivan by this time had moved on steadily into the 60s, but unfortunately Grey returned to claim his 5th wicket of the match leaving Ivan on 67 and the team on 157-8. Kieron lasted 14 balls without adding to the score. Skipper Shaneil then had young Joe Adderley join him at the crease for the last wicket and it was left to those two to save the game. Joe was guided well throughout, facing 6 nail biting overs of pace from Grey at one end and the guile and experience of Tom Sephton at the other. So the match was saved in those remaining overs with Shaneil finishing unbeaten on 17 and Joe on 6 n.o. including a boundary, so well done to him, a good experience which will stand him in good stead for the future I'm sure.

### SATURDAY 10th MAY, WIGAN v FIRWOOD BOOTLE

#### Firwood Bootle 243-7 dec (51.3); Wigan 180-9 (46) - Match drawn

It was a healthy start to the day for Majic and myself as we filled up at the Lean Kitchen in Pemberton beforehand. The Lean Kitchen? In Wigan? It's even more famous for pies than Rugby League! Sounds like a real contradiction doesn't it, but it was actually very good. Once we began we maintained our unbeaten start to the league season with another draw, but this time we were on the brink of winning it, instead of last week when we performed heroics against Northern in saving the game. After losing the toss and being put in to bat, the game started slowly until Ivan was joined at the crease by Sagar with the score on 101-5. Ivan has really taken off since he joined us scoring 92 on his debut at Birkenhead Park and a vital 67 in last week's draw with Northern. He followed those two scores with another huge one here but again just falling short of his maiden century for us, getting out on 96. Sagar played a big part too and between them they put on a stand of 132 (our biggest of the season so far). Sagar's 73 included 5 fours and 5 sixes, that's exactly 50 runs in boundaries, off just 65 balls. It was great to watch while at the other end when it looked like Ivan was heading for his ton with a measured performance, he must have been so disappointed to miss out. He scored 11 fours and 2 sixes off 122 balls. It has to be said that one of those sixes just happened to smash through the rear window of the Tangerine Dream Mk II. It was only 2 days old but that's the risk when you come to watch Bootle. I missed about 3 hours play while I was trying to contact Auto Windscreens! But anyway once Sagar was out Shaneil called the declaration at 243-7. Sagar was also a big influence with the ball too ending with excellent figures of 5-51 off 16 overs, ably backed up by Jhangir, 4-64 off 13 overs. Barrow was the Wigan player who saw his team home in the final overs and managed to reach 51 not out. Boundaries were easy to score as we crowded the bat trying to claim the wicket that would give us another win but it wasn't to be this time. So we can now look forward to the next challenge. A home game v. Ormskirk doesn't seem so daunting now.
