NEWS AND VIEWS

Welcome to Wadham Road for today's match in the Love Lane Liverpool Competition for our Premier league fixture against Northern CC. welcome to their players, officials and supporters too. We also extend a warm welcome to today's Umpires Paul Vandome and Peter Crook. We're looking forward to an exciting season ahead in our return to the Premier League and I'm sure the players won't disappoint us in that respect. It's also an opportunity to refresh friendly rivalries. Northern only managed to finish runners up to Ormskirk last season so will be planning to go one better this time. It's bound to be a tough test today but I know we'll be up for it.

SATURDAY 26th APRIL, BIRKENHEAD PARK v FIRWOOD BOOTLE Birkenhead Park 236-5 decl. (45); Firwood Bootle 240-6 (52) Firwood Bootle won by 4 wickets

Our first game back in the Premier League for 3 years and it was like we've never been away. It was a tense and exciting finish, but which ended in victory for us with some overs to spare. Sagar Trivedi and Kieron New opened the bowling with Park's opening pair getting off to a lively start, but once they found their line and length the run rate slowed considerably. Sagar's only wicket was in this opening spell, sending opener Langford's stumps crashing. Then Kieron followed up with two more, one of them a very smart caught and bowled. Jhangir took a good catch for Kieron's first wicket, Park's danger man Mark Rowland, after earlier dropping a difficult chance which he managed to get a hand to, but couldn't quite hang on. So with Park on 35-3 at this time things were looking promising, but once Andrew Clarke got going he seemingly took the game away from us. Along with skipper Alex Harris they put on a 4th wicket partnership of 103. Jaden Rose had come on for Sagar by this time and managed to trap Harris Ibw for 26, but Clarke just ploughed on helped along by Ahmad Safi Abdullah. We had two players making their league debut (Ivan Kriek and Kris Ali), who both proved their selection in the Digman Trophy with the bat last week. This time Ivan took the ball and turned his arm over for a spell. So, with Clarke just 2 runs short of his hundred Kris took a fine catch behind the stumps. Hopefully this will turn out to be a good partnership in the future... c Ali b Kriek. Clarke's 98 came off 102 balls, including 10 fours and 4 sixes.

Abdullah meanwhile took over the reins for Park and continued where Clarke left off scoring an unbeaten 64 off just 46 balls. It seemed a bit premature but at the end of the 45th over skipper Alex Harris called their players in and declared on 236-5. Maybe Birkenhead Park fancied their chances of winning this, even though it was obviously a good batting track. They were soon proved to be wrong when Ryan Westwell and Steve Rimmer walked out to the crease. Bootle old boy Chris Stenhouse opened the bowling but had no luck, Steve got off to a flying start scoring 23 runs off 24 balls. It was a solid start as they reached a 50 partnership in the 13th over. Ryan proved to be a steady partner for Steve and by the time drinks were

taken at 5:00 we were already 113 with Steve on 64 and Ryan an unbeaten 47. They motored on and hardly gave a chance away until the end of the 31st over when Westy was trapped lbw for 53. It was a fine innings in his first serious knock of the season, helping to produce a partnership of 146, which is the best they've had while playing together here. In 2022 when Steve Rimmer was at Liverpool he was part of a 110 run partnership against Northop Hall. Ryan meanwhile, in his early years at Prestatyn was involved in half a dozen or so match winning century partnerships, so he's no stranger to sticking around. His 53 came off 99 balls and included 11 fours. The umpired signalled the last 20 overs at 5:47, leaving us to hit 70 runs to win with 9 wickets remaining. The position we were in I thought made us favourites to win the match but we lost Ali Andrady and Steve in quick succession. Unfortunately Steve missed out on his maiden hundred in the Liverpool Comp when he tried an ambitious stroke which had him caught behind. Those 94 runs (his best for Bootle) were made off 104 balls including 13 fours and 2 sixes. That left the new debutants, Kris Ali and Ivan Kriek together and they got us close to the finishing line putting on a vital 41 runs. Ivan tried to win it with a mighty blow. He'd already hit a huge six, but tried one too many holing out on the boundary for 21. Kris also tried to push the score along but was clean bowled for 26, so having lost Sagar in between for 17 runs, it was becoming a tense battle by now. Having lost our big hitters it was up to Josh Andrady and Jaden Rose to guide us home winning the match by 4 wickets. I can't remember who said it, but, "if you're going to slash, slash hard" was certainly true as it paid off for Jaden turning out to be the winning run scorer.
